Village Hall: Last week saw an update on the Village Hall Improvement Project which has progressed well despite some unforeseen problems. The problems concerned the drains. Most of us are aware that a good downpour, and we've had a few the last month or so, sees Moggerhanger drains struggling. Unfortunately for the Village Hall we are near the end of the run so can suffer more than most. During the recent heavy rain we have had problems with the drains backing up and much 'gurgling' within the building. Our drains are not blocked but low compared to the main sewer. In times of heavy rain the main sewer effectively overflows, hence the backup. To combat this problem we have installed some new drain runs prior to the installation of the new paving. Upon excavation as part of the paving work we discovered a collapsed drain which has had to be lifted. Obviousley it was important to do this work prior to the installation of the new paving. Sadly we did not have funds for this work, having cleared our loan last year. This has meant we have had to take a loan to cover this work, although at a much lower rate than the previous loan. We have secured £4,500 at 3.6% which we will endeavor to pay back over the next twelve months.

We have a number of fund raising events planned for the rest of the year and would encourage everyone to support these to enable us to clear this loan as soon as we can. **St Johns Church:** The Revd.
