**Gypsy and Traveller Local Plan:** Earlier this year consultation was undertaken by Central Bedfordshire regarding this plan and at that time Moggerhanger was removed from the shortlist, but still remains on the long list. This early consultation is not done by all councils and is only preliminary to the formal consultation period which runs from May 20 until July 1.

This formal consultation is the most important, following which the council will give a summarised assessment of the views received to the Inspectorate. The council could make alterations to the Plan they have already proposed before it is sent to the Inspector, however any comments made during the earlier consultation will not be forwarded as they are not part of this formal consultation.

In addition to their summary the Council are required to send to the Inspector the full list of sites that were originally considered i.e. the long list. The Inspector will look at the council's conclusions and reasons for selecting the shortlist, and consider responses from the formal consultation round, not the earlier consultation round. The Inspector will decide whether or not they agree with the Council's findings, and if not may propose alternative sites from the long list, which would include Moggerhanger.

It is vitally important that all previous comments made in the earlier consultation are now re-iterated as part of this formal consultation to ensure your comments are included in the information sent to the Secretary of State and his Inspector.
