followed by the election of officers for 2014-15; Mr C Bashford, Mr G Adams, Mrs C Lister, Ms J Warren, Ms J Hobson, Mr R Allen, and Mr P Milton.

Mrs Elizabeth Barrance MBE has served Moggerhanger community well for many years, including holding the office of trustee at the village hall. As a mark of respect for her many years' service the trustees voted to elect her as the village hall President, a decision supported unanimously on the evening. Mr Bashford presented Mrs Barrance with a framed certificate to mark the occasion.

After formal closure of the meeting Mrs C Lister updated those present on the land purchase 'Buy a Plot' scheme. There were still ten plots to be sold to cover the costs of purchasing the land including solicitor and Land Registry fees. These were instantly sold with further requests for additional plots. This scheme will be officially closed at the end of April. After that the final figure raised will be announced and an outline of the plots sold and a list of donators will be framed and placed at the village hall to mark this fantastic achievement.

The evening finished with a light hearted mini auction and a raffle.

Many thanks to our social team for producing a lovely buffet and to everyone for attending and supporting the evening. We raised £326.69 in addition to the 'Buy a Plot'.

Moggerhanger Gardening Club:

On April 16 we had a very interesting talk about Warden Abbey Vineyard, which is situated on the road from Old Warden to Cardington. The Manager Jane Markham told us that there had been a vineyard there since the 1100s, run by the monks of Warden Abbey until the dissolution of the monasteries in 1537. The modern site occupies about 1/3 of the original and since 2010 is run by Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity as one of its many projects to foster rural life in Bedfordshire. Planted in 1986 by the Whitbread family, the vineyard's production is not huge, depending on the year of course, but the quality of what we sampled was very good. Everything is done by volunteers and once the harvest is in the grapes go to a company in Surrey for pressing and bottling.

We were also told of the Warden pear, which is mentioned by Shakespeare. Recently it has been replanted and the vineyard also has a young tree

Altogether a very interesting evening, with a tasting also, followed by the usual tea and coffee with home-made cakes.

The next meeting will be on June 26, but on Wednesday, May 21 there is a planned visit to Edible Ornamentals at Chawston for a tour of the nursery and a chilli tasting session. For details and booking contact Jackie Warren on 01767 640790.
